







Save-the-date! Two doctoral seminars in Sweden in August/September 2022

The law faculties at Uppsala University and Stockholm University are organizing two international seminars in tax law, on transfer pricing and related issues (Stockholm, 30-31 August 2022) and on comparative tax law (Uppsala, 1-2 September 2022). Qualifying candidates are welcome to attend either one, or both of the seminars. Arlanda airport is conveniently located between Stockholm and Uppsala. The seminars are free of charge and require a workload covering 7,5 ECTS. An invitation with the final programs will be sent in the spring of 2022. Participants will also be invited to an event organized by the Swedish branch of IFA on 31 August 2022.

Transfer pricing: material and methodological issues (Stockholm, 30-31 August 2022)

The Law Faculty at Stockholm University organises an international seminar open to doctoral candidates who are working in the field of transfer pricing and related issues such as Pillar 1 or transfer pricing and State aid.

Together with prominent experts who have extensively published and/or worked in the field of transfer pricing, participants will be able to exchange their views and experiences on various material and methodological issues. The seminar comprises a combination of presentations from the tutors, the participants, and workshops in small groups.
